



Illuminating Climate Justice: a shadow puppetry workshop with Oanh Vu

Outdoor Activity: Explore Your Climate

Go outside on a sunny day and measure the temperature of different things in the neighborhood: grass, buildings, sidewalks, etc You can either use a thermometer or just use your hands to feel the different temperatures in the sun versus the shade. What do you notice?

Stand in the shade of a tree vs the shade of a building, and think about why some things and places feel hotter than other things and places, and how that might influence the climate of your neighborhood and other neighborhoods

Call to Action: Contact your Representatives

Your voice matters -- write (or draw) a postcard to your representatives asking them to take action to stop climate change. One key way we can do that is by stopping the construction of the Line 3 pipeline. Line 3 would contribute more to climate change than Minnesota's *entire* economy!

Construction of Line 3 has already begun on Anishinaabe land. Pipelines often pollute the surrounding areas, so the Anishinaabe people oppose its construction as it is a violation of their treaty rights.

Help honor Anishinaabe treaty rights, protect the water, and help us reduce fossil fuel consumption (a main contributor to Climate Change) by writing a postcard to your lawmakers! Write a postcard to Senator Amy Klobuchar, Senator Tina Smith, Governor Tim Walz, or Lieutenant Governor Peggy Flanagan asking them to stop the construction of the Line 3 Oil Pipeline.
